A few years ago, there was a fantastic book about the Hmong people in America entitled, "When the Spirit Catches You and You Fall Down." It was a fantastic read that helped me understand more about the way life changes for Hmong immigrants in America. The title has always stuck with me because we are people caught by the Holy Spirit and our lives change as a result.

The Holy Spirit catches us – and calls us to continually grow as followers of Jesus Christ. When you were baptized, the Holy Spirit began working in you, shaping you to be the people of God who follow our Lord in all of life. She draws us out of life and challenges us to become partners in God's healing and life-giving activities in the world.

Our mission statement helps us think about living as Spirit-caught people. It says, "Helping people make a life-changing connection with Jesus Christ, St. Luke's is a faith community committed to connecting, growing and serving." Even though the Holy Spirit isn't named in our mission statement, her work is on full display. When we are caught by the Holy Spirit, our lives are changed and we are sent into the world as God's life-changing people. The Holy Spirit helps us connect with God and others. The Spirit helps us grow in Christian faith and action. The Holy Spirit empowers us to serve.

We are caught by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is at work in us, reshaping us to be God's life-giving partners. God's mission becomes ours: to help the work become as God intends it to be.


# **Dedicating Worship Appointments**

# **Debt & Mortgage Reduction/Finance Update**

We continue to be grateful to everyone who supports St. Luke's with their weekly, monthly, annual, and one-time gifts. **Continue to or become generous in your giving**.

At the end of April and year-one, contributions to the debt reduction campaign totaled \$318,039 being contributed by 242 Giving Units, including 62 Giving Units who did not make a pledge but have contributed. Recall that our three-year goal is \$750,000.

General Fund 2019 giving, which supports our ministries continues to remain under budget by about 20% after four months and it is important to remember that we increased our budget by about 8% to fund on-going programs and changes to our pastoral staff.

While we are very thankful for the capital campaign contributions, it is also important that the congregation continues to give to our general fund, particularly during the summer months when we typically see a decline in offerings. Please prayerfully consider your continued and possibly increased giving in order to maintain the normal, ongoing ministries of St Luke's.

It is important that our general giving does not create the same large deficit as we had at the end of 2017. Enjoy the summer and we look forward to seeing everyone in church in September. Consider attending the Saturday evening service if your summer Sundays are set aside for sporting and family vacation events.
