



Ministry WITH & FOR People of All Ages

St. Luke's has a variety of ministries that engage people across the many ages of life. This community is proud of the mission to which God calls us: *Helping people make a life-changing connection with Jesus Christ, St. Luke's is a faith community committed to Connecting, Growing and Serving.* No matter a person's age, there are a variety of ways for people to become involved. No matter who you are or the age of life in which you find yourself, there are many ways to engage in ministry or to be ministered to in and through St. Luke's.

Think of the variety of ages present in our community every week. On a typical weekend, for example, people of many of ages are present in worship. We regularly worship among people carrying infants and folks who share the wisdom of the years. Ministry groups active in worship leadership show the variety of ages present and active at St. Luke's. Assisting Ministers are usually from among our elders, though there is room (and an open invitation) for younger folk to lead, too. Music ensembles engage the young (such as Angel Choir and Saints & Sinners) and those who are beyond high school by a few or many years (such as the Voices of Faith and Godsbells). While acolytes are typically young, communion servers and lectors are a variety of ages.

Mondays, the Amigos (a group of retired men) serve among us, caring for the building by using the gifts they have learned through the years. Tuesdays, Needle &Thimble quilt for Lutheran World Relief. They are usually people who are retired. No matter your age, there's a ministry group in which you can become active.

Thank you, to all who are retired, who share your gifts in ministry and participate in so much of what happens at St. Luke's. You are an important part of this community. I think of ministries related to funerals – often it is retired folk who are present and serving, to make sure we set a table of hospitality and healing. I think of those who gather weekly for Search Bible Study, which is, generally, an older group, though there is room for those who are younger. Theology on Tap and Theology Uncorked are other examples of ministries that engage our seniors (and some who are younger) in important ways.

If you are among the seniors in our congregation, I encourage you to keep your eyes open for St. Luke's Potluck Luncheons & Programs. You can find the monthly schedule of activities in a blue flyer at the Welcome Station. Information about outings sponsored by our Forever Forty group is posted regularly in this newsletter and bulletin. This is another important ministry to seniors.

Serving families is important to St. Luke's, as well. Child Life Ministries continues to be a cornerstone ministry of St. Luke's. Each day we serve more than a hundred families by providing them with childcare, preschool and a four-year-old Kindergarten program. St. Luke's Youth Ministry, Vacation Bible School, Holy Communion Classes, and Sunday School opportunities reach families and their children/youth in a variety of ways.

No matter your age, there are a variety of ways you can be involved. You can engage in ministries with your peers around service opportunities, such as Mission Possible opportunities, Holiday Ministries, volunteering at the Waukesha Food Pantry, supporting the Women's Center, pounding nails on a Habitat for Humanity build, traveling on an Adult Mission Trip, tutoring at Whittier Elementary and more.

Jesus calls us to be disciples engaged in ministry, no matter our age, so we serve in a variety of ways. There is a place in and through this community to share your gifts for ministry. All ages are important and welcome!

- Pastor Jordan served as co-chair of the Local Area Committee for the ELCA's Churchwide Assembly being held in Milwaukee, August 5-10. He and Susan Cyr of St. John's Lutheran, Brookfield, coordinated 600 volunteers who hosted about 2,400 people from across the United States and the Caribbean.
- Mr. Schaner attended the biannual national convention of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians in Portland, OR at the end of June along with over 300 other Lutheran Church musicians. He also attended the composer's residency with composer Shawn Kirchner and conductor John Hughes at Ripon College in August. Thank you for your support so we can attend continuing education events!

Call Committee Update

The council truly appreciates all the hours of pre-planning, setup, preparation and activities that make for a great week. It was awesome. GOD IS GOOD – ALL THE TIME!!!
- As a kick-off to the new school year, the CLM Board has scheduled a CLM Staff Appreciation event. A cookout will be held at St. Luke's on the evening of September 11 at 5:45 p.m. It's another opportunity to thank the teachers and staff who provide such special care for over 100 families. The Hospitality Team is assisting with the logistics. If you would like to help with food, setup or cleanup, check in with Bill Oliver.

- Mark your calendars! Another reminder of the worship time changes beginning on Sunday, September 8. Services will be at 8:15 am and 10:00 am. Finance Committee Update

Summer is about over and on the weekend of September 7/8, 2019, we move into our fall worship schedule along with Sunday School and Discipleship Training (Confirmation) classes.

We had a busy summer, programing wise, with a very successful Music Camp, the Silent Auction, Spaghetti Dinner and Youth trip to Clendenin, WV, CLM Preschool Fun Days, serving meals for kids and teens at Roberta Park from June 10 to July 3, the Habitat, Waukesha Work Days, Vacation Bible School with 114 children attending the week-long program, the Call Committee's activity with the process of calling a permanent Associate Pastor, and the every Monday project work day for the Amigos.

Our current three-year debt reduction program continues, and we are very thankful for the contributions, both pledged and non-pledged received to date, which totals \$363,194 towards our goal of \$750,000.

As of July 31,2019, the church continues to experience a significant downturn in giving year to date. The Finance Committee wishes to remind all our congregational members and friends that funding of our usual and ordinary expenses as well as programs for our community and abroad, urgently need your regular support.

The Churchwide Assembly of the ELCA met in Milwaukee in August. The ELCA Churchwide Assembly is the primary decision-making body of the church. It is a process of communal spiritual discernment. It gathers as the living body of Christ guided by the Spirit and conformed to God's will to discuss and make decisions about how to go about God's work as a church. This year the assembly gathered under the theme *We Are Church*.

When an ELCA Churchwide Assembly convenes, its voting members meet with confidence in God's grace around word and water, wine and bread, to carry on their work on behalf the entire church. Over the course of an assembly, voting members:

- Hear reports and review the work of churchwide officers, leaders and units;
- Receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies;
- Elect officers, board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws;
- Establish ELCA churchwide policy;
- Worship together;
- Adopt a budget; and
- Conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.

The voting members of the 2019 Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) made a number of key decisions to further the mission and ministry of this church.

More than 900 voting members:

- Reelected the Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton to a six-year term as ELCA Presiding Bishop.
- Elected Deacon Sue Rothmeyer to a six-year term as ELCA secretary.
- Approved the social statement "Faith, Sexism and Justice: A Call to Action" and its implementing resolutions. The social statement, in part, names patriarchy and sexism as sins and calls the church to action on a range of issues, including gender-based violence, workplace discrimination and economic inequality.
- Adopted "A Declaration of Inter-Religious Commitment," which will serve as church policy for inter-religious relations. The policy statement was adopted with the witness of 39 ecumenical and inter-religious guests in attendance.
- Approved the triennium budget for 2020-2022, which includes a current fund spending authorization of \$68,378,325 for 2020, a current fund income proposal of \$68,442,034 for 2021 and \$68,507,018 for 2022; and an ELCA World Hunger spending authorization of \$21.5 million 2020, and an income proposal of \$21.5 million for 2021 and for 2022.
- Adopted the "Strategy Toward Authentic Diversity in the ELCA," which consists of a report and recommendations on how the ELCA exhibits authentic diversity and formulates goals for racial diversity and inclusion.
- Witnessed the presentation of the "Declaration of the ELCA to People of African Descent," which was accepted by the Rev. Lamont A. Wells, president of the African Descent Lutheran Association (ADLA), and members of ADLA.
- Adopted 26 memorials en bloc, ranging in topics from gun violence to engagement in the Holy Land and gender identity to seminary tuition.
- Adopted a memorial that affirms the ELCA's long-standing commitment to migrants and refugees and declares the ELCA a sanctuary church body.
- Adopted a memorial that calls for the development of a social statement and social message on the relationship of church and state.
- Adopted a memorial to encourage all synods and congregations to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the ELCA's ordination of women in 2020, the 40th anniversary of the ordination of women of color in the Lutheran tradition and the 10th anniversary of the ELCA's decision to remove barriers to ordination for people in same-gender relationships.
- Adopted a memorial to support the vision and goals of the Poor People's Campaign that align with the ELCA's social teachings.
- Adopted a series of amendments to the "Constitutions, Bylaws and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America," including one that makes ordination the entrance rite for ministers of Word and Service, and an amendment to no longer count deacons as laypeople for representational principles.
- Adopted a resolution that committed the ELCA to support the World Council of Church's "Thursdays in Black" campaign toward a world without rape and violence.

- Adopted a resolution to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance in the ELCA for the martyrdom of the Emanuel 9—the nine people who were shot and killed June 17, 2015, during a Bible study at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, S.C.
- Adopted a resolution to condemn white supremacy, calling all ELCA congregations to engage in
 a "study of the structures and rhetoric that empower and fuel racism and white supremacy and
 to take to heart the teaching of Scriptures, so we may all be better equipped to speak boldly about
 the equal dignity of all persons in the eyes of God."
- Celebrated the end of Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA, which concluded June 30 with nearly \$250 million raised in cash, multiyear commitments and planned gift commitments.
- Elected members to serve on the ELCA Church Council, churchwide committees and churchwide boards, including Portico Benefit Services, the Mission Investment Fund and 1517 Media.

ELCA Churchwide Assembly declares the ELCA a sanctuary church

The 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly voted August 7 to approve a memorial that affirms the denomination's long-standing commitment to migrants and refugees and declares the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) a sanctuary church body. The ELCA is the first North American denomination to declare itself a sanctuary church body. As a sanctuary church, the ELCA publicly declares that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith. This declaration does not call for any person, congregation or synod to engage in illegal activity.

The ELCA has developed talking points to address what it means for this church to become a sanctuary denomination. In defining what this means for its congregations, the ELCA states that a sanctuary church will look different in the different contexts across the ELCA. The church cannot mandate or direct ELCA congregations and ministries to respond in certain ways.

The 2016 ELCA Churchwide Assembly passed the strategy to Accompany Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities (AMMPARO). Through the strategy, the ELCA invites its churches to become "welcoming congregations," which means to commit to spiritually and physically accompanying migrants in their communities, pray for migrant children and families, and advocate for a just and humane immigration system. More than 100 congregations and five synods across the ELCA identify as sanctuary.





- There will be a parent/youth meeting for those entering Grades 7 & 8, Sunday, September 8.
- Those in Grades 7 & 8 will normally meet regularly on Sundays, 11:15 a.m. to 1:15 p.m.
- Third year DT students will meet Wednesdays, 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. beginning September 11, until the Wednesday before Affirmation of Baptism, which is on October 27, 2019. *Parents, please attend on September 11*.
- DT will have occasional road trips, allowing youth opportunities to grow through a variety of experiences. We will utilize parents to help us get to and from these events.
- Our pastors will be regularly involved in Discipleship Training.
- We are incorporating Host Parents into the Discipleship Ministry. Host Parents will have two roles: 1) to provide meals for the group and 2) to participate as guides/mentors for the group.
