SECOND LESSON

1 Corinthians 1:10

¹⁰Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. ¹¹For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. ¹²What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." ¹³Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶(I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know

whether I baptized anyone else.)¹⁷For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

¹⁸For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

²³Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the dominion of heaven and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

Annual Meeting of St. Luke's Lutheran Church will be held on Sunday, February 16, 2019 at 11:15am in the Sanctuary. This is an important event in the life of our congregation. In addition to receiving the reports of our ministries, council and committees, we will also be electing members to the Congregation Council and to the Personnel, Finance and Nominating Committees. The 2019 Budget Review will take place on February 9th after 1st service in the Chapel.

Assisting Minister Meeting: AMs will meet **January 26**, 11:30 a.m. to review procedures, talk about what is going well and to learn. Together, we will welcome and train new Assisting Ministers. We will meet in the front of the church.

Usher Meeting: Pastor Jordan is calling an usher meeting for Sunday, February 9, at 11:15 a.m. The purpose of this meeting is to check in about duties, talk about what is going well and to learn together. We will also talk about scheduling. This meeting is for all current ushers and those who wish to serve as ushers but haven't done it before. We will meet in the chapel.

Mission Envelopes for January: This month we support Lutheran Disaster response by leaving gifts that make a long-term impact. This organization of the ELCA brings God's hope, healing and renewal to people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. In 2019 Lutheran Disaster Response provided ongoing

assistance to those affected by wildfires, hurricanes, tsunamis, flooding, earthquakes, drought, war and conflicts.

Waukesha Food Pantry: During January consider the donation of non-food items: personal hygiene items, laundry detergent, household cleaning supplies, toilet paper, disposable diapers and baby wipes – all items that cannot be purchased with food stamps.

Homeless Shelter Meals: The Homeless Shelter for Women and Children is open for the winter and houses up to 20 folks. St. Luke's is serving a warm meal every Monday evening until the Shelter closes in March or April. Each week there is a leader who decides the menu, finds a couple of people to help prepare the hot meal, and delivers it to the shelter between 5 and 5:30 pm. Serving and cleanup is optional.
