Proposed Governing Documents Now Available

A dedicated team of volunteers has been preparing updated governing documents for the church: constitutional provisions, bylaws, and continuing resolutions. This work has been done to bring us into conformity with required ELCA provisions, to update our documents to reflect what we are doing, and to clarify areas of uncertainty.
