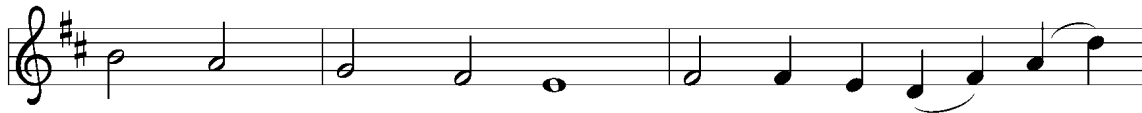

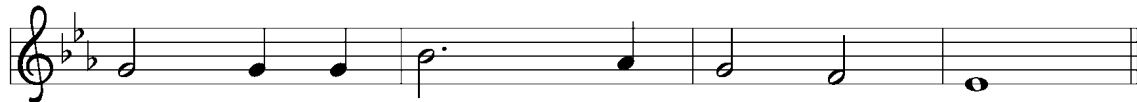

Proposed Governing Documents Now Available

A dedicated team of volunteers has been preparing updated governing documents for the church: constitutional provisions, bylaws, and continuing resolutions. This work has been done to bring us into conformity with required ELCA provisions, to update our documents to reflect what we are doing, and to clarify areas of uncertainty. In October, proposed governing documents were considered by the church council. *A listening post for congregational feedback will happen in Adult Forum, November 21.* An executive summary of changes is included in this newsletter. Congregational Meeting Called: December 12

The Council has called a special meeting of the congregation for **Sunday, December 12, 9:15 a.m.** The purpose of this meeting is to approve proposed changes to our governing documents as summarized in the Executive Summary document included in this newsletter. Full versions of the proposed governing documents are available at the Welcome Center or via a download on our homepage of our website. No other business will be conducted.

Sunday School

Sunday school welcomes children that are around the age of 3 to 12 into the sanctuary after worship. Sunday school is a space that can include the presence of our parents, grandparents, guardians, and mentors. We begin in the sanctuary at 9:30 am after worship with an opening, and then break into small groups for a Bible lesson and activity. Sunday school ends at 10:15 am, the youth can be picked up near the hospitality area on the main level of the church by their families.

Discipleship Training or DT is a ministry that helps our youth confirm their faith. Discipleship training meets downstairs in the youth room and starts at 9:15 am and ends at 10:15 am. Every week the youth dive into their faith through games, Bibles lessons, and sometimes food. This ministry serves the youth in grades seven and eight.

GOSPEL MESSAGE

November 21, 2021

CHRIST THE KING

What Kind of Kingdom?

Some have interpreted Jesus' statement "My kingdom is not from this world" (John 18:36) to mean that Jesus promises good things only in some distant future, as if we need not worry about justice or poverty in this life. However, in his actions and teachings throughout his life, Jesus clearly cared very much about the here and now of this world.

In the Lord's prayer, we say, "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven." We are praying for God's will in this world, the only home and society we know. But what does it look like for God's will to be done on earth?

Jesus disappointed his followers, who expected a revolutionary leader. In generation after generation, revolutions come and go. Those who were on the bottom get to be on the top for a spell. Inevitably, we have the same old concentration of power in high places, insiders versus outsiders, the haves and the have-nots. The names and titles change, but the system does not.

By the typical standards of a political revolution, Jesus' execution meant he was a total failure. But he embodied a different kind of power, testifying to a truth larger and deeper and ultimately stronger than any revolution. In his crucifixion and resurrection, Jesus jammed up the whole system that keeps cycling back around to perpetuate violence, retribution, inequality, and exclusion.

Through Jesus, the kingdom of God breaks in amid the old kingdoms that rise and fall, bringing a new reign of love, forgiveness, and peace. As a beloved community that longs to break free from old cycles of worldly power, we continue to pray for God's kingdom to come, for renewal that is deeper and more lasting than any political movement. And we continue to work for a world where all of God's children and God's creation are treated with respect, justice, and love.
