Finding a Watch Word for 2024

I have a friend who is a Moravian Christian Pastor. We studied together at Luther Seminary. Moravians are a church born of the Lutheran Reformation in 16th century Germany. Tracy tells me that Moravian Christians have an annual tradition of choosing a “watch word” for each year. At the beginning of the year, leaders place scripture citations in a bowl, and worshippers draw a watch word for the year. They memorize the scripture they pull and let it speak to them throughout the year, reciting it several times a day, reflecting on it throughout the year.

I’ve drawn on this tradition in working with youth. I’ve had them choose a “Guiding Word” at the beginning of each confirmation season. I’ve had them memorize it, write about it, reflect on it, and conduct a project based on it. For a year, the students reflect on scripture and wonder what it means for them.



It’s January, and a new year is on us. How might the Word of the Lord guide you in the coming year? I’d like to encourage you to choose a Watch Word or Guiding Word for the year. God will bless you richly through doing so, helping you interact with a particular scripture as you make your way through 2024. Below are some suggested passages from which you may choose.

Some Potential Watch Words or Guiding Words

Job: 19:25-27	I know that my redeemer lives.
Psalms 23	The Lord is my Shepherd.
Psalms 121	My help comes from the Lord.
Luke 1:46-50	God has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant.
Luke 12:32-34	Do not be afraid... Where your treasure is, there your heart will be.
John 1:1-5	Jesus is the Word, a light shining in the darkness.
John 3:14-17	Believing in Jesus brings eternal life.
John 10:11-15	Jesus says, “I am the good shepherd who lays down his life.”
John 14:1-6	Jesus says, “I am the way, the truth and the life....”
Romans 6:3-5	In Holy Baptism we are joined with Jesus in death and resurrection.
Romans 8:26-28	The Spirit helps us in our weakness.
1 Cor. 1:16-21	The foolish message of the cross is the power of God for salvation.
Gal. 2:16, 19b-20	Crucified with Christ, Christ lives in me.

You can easily learn your chosen Guiding Word by reciting it when you get up in the morning or when you lie down at night. You can tape it to your mirror. You might consider placing it in your car... No matter how you use it, God will bless you through it.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Christmas can be a magical time for many people in our culture. However, as we live in this world, we become connected in relationships with other people, places, or things. Sometimes, we lose connection with our relationships, and especially during the holidays, the loss can trigger pain. So, the group wrestled with the idea that celebrating Christmas can take a toll on us physically, mentally, and spiritually, especially if we have lived longer than fifty years.

As we live in this world, we will experience much loss, especially the loss of relationships. The loss of people, places, or things can make it more challenging to celebrate Christmas gloriously as we once did in the past.

Christmas is a gift, but Christmas can also be difficult for those who have experienced loss or trauma. However, Jesus is always present, especially during this time of year. There is a reason that Blue Christmas services have become more prominent. It seems that people's hurt has impacted Christmas and led them to Jesus, which, in some ways, is good news. It is possible to celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior and our loss, knowing that God is with us as we celebrate and lament, especially during the holidays. We can always stand in solidarity, which can be something new for 2024.

Most of the celebration of Christmas is over, and we now look forward to Epiphany and Pastor Steve's birthday. Pastor Steve's birthday is on January 6th, which he will not celebrate because having a birthday after Christmas takes too much energy. However, maybe this is a good time for rest. The holidays are over, and it is a time for some normalcy.

Yet, the Lenten season and Easter are just around the corner, which then leads to the beginning of spring and then summer. Then, the school year starts. We rally on rally day, and then it returns to Christmas again. Whoa, it's already 2025, even before 2024 has begun.
