Bonhoeffer: Remembering the Saint

Travelers headed to this year's congregational trip to Germany will be introduced to a prominent Lutheran figure of the 20th Century. Perhaps you've heard of him: Dietrich Bonhoeffer. I first came into contact with his writings in the late 1980s, while taking a religion class in college. I quickly learned that much of my faith had been shaped by his thoughts; his teachings having been instilled in the pastors of childhood.

Here's how a former professor of mine, Gary Simpson of Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN, describes Bonhoeffer:




Dietrich Bonhoeffer (1906-1945) was a German Lutheran pastor, theologian, and martyr who lived his adult life under the fascist Nazi regime of Adolf Hitler's Third Reich. Bonhoeffer had resisted the totalitarian tyranny of Nazism from its takeover of Germany beginning in January 1933, and on the radio, he openly denounced Hitler's April 1933 Aryan Civil Service law, which had banned Jews from being German civil servants, and which eventually led to the murder of over six million European Jews. Bonhoeffer's resistance to Hitler grew throughout the 1930s, and he became an influential young leader of the Protestant "confessing church struggle" against the Nazification of German Protestantism. In July 1940 Bonhoeffer's brother-in-law, Hans von Dohnanyi, convinced him to join a conspiracy group within Hitler's own military intelligence to assassinate Hitler. Bonhoeffer became a double agent. In April 1943, Bonhoeffer was arrested, imprisoned, and interrogated. Two years later, Hitler personally gave the order to execute Bonhoeffer along with other conspirators, which was carried out at Flossenbürg Prison on April 9, 1945, just two weeks before the Allied forces entered Berlin. His story was recently memorialized in a very popular book about his life and death by Eric Metaxas. It is a good read, though his theological interpretations of Bonhoeffer aren't always adequate and sometimes tell us more about Metaxas' theology than Bonhoeffer's. You can find this book on Amazon or through our local bookstores. Printed in 2020, it was very successful in book stores as it tells the story of a man who dared face the evils of Nazism in the 1930s.

There's not much to see about this giant of the faith in Germany, but his memory looms large. In Berlin, there is a small museum in his former home. It is only open a few days of the week. Christians, however, have drawn inspiration from this great saint who reminds us that Christians make hard choices in the face of this world's evil. We do not participate in the obliteration of others who are different than we are. Rather, like Christ, we give our lives to save other people.

Consider reading about Bonhoeffer. I've been reading some of his writings as I'm preparing for September's trip to Germany. And, if you'd like to know more about Bonhoeffer or the trip, check in with me. It's a great story and will be an excellent experience.

May This Easter Fill You With Life

We are heading towards Easter Sunday, and we are heading there fast. This is a unique time of year as we experience God's victory over death in real time through the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

This is the time of year when we can come face to face with our "Bad Spiritual Situation" with God. The issue with our relationship is we cannot follow God's will no matter how hard we try. However, we can understand God's answer to this issue is through faith and Jesus' action on the cross.



There can be diversity in thought when speaking about Jesus' crucifixion. A more common understanding is Jesus, being sinless, absorbed our sin on the cross and paid our debt, for our trespasses against God through Jesus' sacrifice.

Another school of thought is that only the one who owes their debt can pay it off in full. Another person cannot take away our debt in full. Therefore, one cannot have their sins or debts removed by some outside source.

However, when one comes to the cross of Christ and sees and experiences the moment of what Jesus has done for them, for us all, they can turn to faith and escape the debt of their sin. As the Gospel of John tells us, just as Moses lifted the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. By looking at Jesus on the cross or at the empty cross, the faithful can acknowledge their sin, turn from their rebellion, and turn to God to save and heal them.

However, is all this just nonsense? Did the resurrection of Jesus Christ really happen? Yes! Some basic science can help us feel more confident in the reality of the resurrection. However, not all questions can be answered by this basic science experiment. It may take a little faith to help build confidence in the answers we find with this experiment.

This is the fundamental science experiment: if you walk around a forest and come upon a pond and see a ripple in the pond, the ripple tells us something happened. That is, the ripple can inform us of an event that has already unfolded. We don't know what happened, but we can assume something did occur. That is the basic science. To extend this pond theme into the realm of the divine, it seems God dropped a massive pebble in the ether of the universe, and we are still feeling, celebrating, and honoring that ripple effect in the pond of space and time. Something happened about two thousand years ago when God dropped life into the universe through Jesus' resurrection, which we continue to experience today.

May this Easter fill you with life as you experience God's love for you through Jesus' resurrection. He is risen; He is risen, indeed, alleluia! The grace of God lives eternally through faith in our risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Thanks be to God that we feel the ripples of life in our present day.

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. Romans 5:6-9 NRSV

Summary of Annual Meeting

The congregation met in its annual meeting between services, February 11. The annual report of the congregation was lifted up as an official summary of the year. The congregation heard a brief report from the Budget and Finance Committee and approved a spending plan for 2024. New members were elected to the Council. The surprise of the event was the signing of a check to the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA, for the monthly mortgage. What made it special was that with that check's signing, our mortgage dropped below a million dollars. This means we've made significant progress because of the New Life Rising Campaign. Thanks to all who participated in the Annual Meeting!

Council Holds Organizational Meeting

The first meeting of the Congregation Council following the annual meeting is an important one for the Council. In it, we organize our work and prepare for the year ahead. February 20, the Council welcomed new members Darius Outlaw, Chris Jackson, and Gloria Brechlin to the table. They were elected at the annual meeting. As usual, we began with a time we call "Dwelling in the Word." It was a reflection on Mark 9. After approving the agenda, we read our Mission, Vision and Core Statements before moving into a period of discussion about what the Council is, what our governing documents direct us to be, and basics about how we functioned. We reviewed an organizational chart of our ministries, took a look at who sits on each committee and then appointed various Council Members to committees of the church. Then came time for the election of the Congregation's Officers. Chris Jackson was elected as President, Jenny Thorstad remained in place as Vice President, Ashley Bregantini is continuing as Secretary, and our Treasurer continues to be Laura Cameron. Following elections, we spent time talking about the commitments of Council Members as leaders, using a well-drafted document that has been guiding the Council for at least 10 years. We then walked through an overview of the (about) 40 employees of St. Luke's, and distributed Employee Handbooks. Then, we heard from Laura about January's finances: After a difficult 2023, we started this year off strong. Council contacts were assigned, Epistle Points from the Council were drafted, and we adjourned at about 8:50 p.m. Continue to pray for your Council.
