Living in Easter

Easter is a celebration of Christ's resurrection. For this reason, it's the most traditional day for baptism. In the early church, people would prepare for baptism over an extended time. They'd learn the faith, read scriptures, and worship with the community. But when it was time for the Holy Meal, those who hadn't been baptized were sent out to study the faith more intently. All of this would change on Easter, when those preparing for baptism would be baptized. Baptized into Christ, the people lived in the hope of Easter.

St. Paul reminds us in Romans 6 that those who are baptized into Christ are joined to him in his death and resurrection. God actually does something to us. In Baptism, God joins us to Good Friday so that we can live in Easter. In other words, Easter hope becomes ours because of what God does for us in Holy Baptism.



Living in Easter has a particular look about it. We describe it every time we baptize somebody and/or when somebody affirms their trust in God's work through Holy Baptism. I love how the baptismal liturgy helps us remember faith practices that cultivate faith in us. We ask parents and sponsors to promise to help their children grow in the Christian faith and life, by practicing these ways. Here's how we put it:

As you bring *your children* to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with *them* among God's faithful people,
bring *them* to the word of God and the holy supper,
teach *them* the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,
place in *their* hands the holy scriptures,
and nurture *them* in faith and prayer,
so that *your children* may learn to trust God,
proclaim Christ through word and deed,
care for others and the world God made,
and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help *your children* grow in the Christian faith and life?

Easter living is the practice of surrounding ourselves with Christian friends and community. Easter living compels us to worship regularly so that we might regularly hear the Word of God and participate in the Holy Meal of Communion. Easter Living uses the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments to shape life. People practicing Easter living reads scripture regularly and nurture lives that are marked with faith and prayer.

Easter living cultivates us to grow lives of faith, to "trust God, proclaim Christ through Word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for Justice and peace." Living out the faith in these ways, draws us closer to God and to others around us.

During this Easter season, continue to cultivate Easter lives that follow Jesus into the transformative practices of the Christian Faith. God will bless you in these practices. Experience the joy of following Jesus more fully.

He is risen

He is risen; He is risen, indeed, alleluia! Death has lost its sting! Hope is resurrected through the risen Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ.

The Bible is a fantastic book that contains God's love for all creation. Albeit a messy creation, God's love for creation permeates the Bible.

The world is a messy place, and sometimes, we can conflate what is happening in the world with the health of God. So, if the world seems to be on the verge of collapse, we might fear that God is on the brink of collapse, or worse, God is dying, or God is dead, which is not true.



God has made creation, and possibly the resources God used to create was Godself. Confusing, yes, but we know God is outside the rules and regulations of this world, the universe, or creation. What happens in creation does not reflect what is going on with God. So, we can feel a sense of calm and peace knowing that God does not disappear even when the world is messy. Throughout history, no matter what has happened throughout space and time, God is consistent with God's presence.

The Bible can be understood as a fantastic love story. However, the Bible also teaches us about accountability, our accountability to love God and our Neighbors. St. Luke's mission is grounded in the Gospel, which means we ground ourselves in God's unconditional love for all people.

The mission is challenging; there is too much need, even in Waukesha. Our response to the need during the Lenten season was to ground ourselves in God's love for our neighbor through peanut butter and jelly. We know many needs arise in our community, especially during the holidays. Too many families in Waukesha need help to obtain essential food items like peanut butter and jelly. Peanut butter and jelly may seem minor, but they can be a considerable source of nutrition for people or families with basic food needs. Something as simple as peanut butter and jelly can be constructive for people with needs.

The world may be messy; the messiness has no bearing on God. However, God invites us to help clean up the mess with our love. Peanut butter and jelly was an excellent way to show love to our neighbor during Lent.
