Celebrating Baptisms

We splash a lot of water in our baptismal font when we baptize somebody. The sounds of the splashes resonate in the building, the mood of all heightens. I love that at each baptism we commit to being a community of faith that surrounds the newly baptized. We promise to help nurture them in faith.

We declare the Lutheran understanding of Holy Baptism when the baptismal rite begins: "In Baptism, our gracious heavenly father sets us free from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ." I always point to this sentence when working with families preparing for baptism. I remind them that it is the best summary of our baptismal theology. This succinct summary reminds us of the following.



First, we are reminded that God does the work of Holy Baptism. God is the actor, and we are the ones being acted upon. It is God's initiative and action that makes Baptism effective. The water doesn't make baptism effective. The pastor doesn't either. Baptism is all about God's promise to do something. In Romans 6, we are reminded that God joins us with Christ through Holy Baptism. As the water washes over us, God joins us to his death and his resurrection. In Holy Baptism, we are put to death with Christ and raised again to new life in Christ's resurrection.

Second, we are reminded that God's work in Holy Baptism results in liberation. God sets us free. We are released from bondage. Sin and death are the captivities from which God sets us free. As God joins us with Christ in his death and resurrection, we are raised to new life. Sin and death no longer hold us. We are raised to new life.

Finally, in this simple summary we are reminded that the cross and the empty grave of Jesus are central signs of what God's work in our lives. God uses the death and resurrection of Jesus to bring new life. The cross stands among us and is honored by us because it is the symbol of the death to which we are joined. The empty grave announces that God takes action in the face of death. In the cross and empty grave, God did God's best work for us. He opened the way to eternal life.

During the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John, son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,

“The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

‘Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.

‘Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth,

‘and all flesh shall see the salvation of God.’”

Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

Dear friends, I believe a band called the Byrds wrote the song “Turn! Turn! Turn!”. The music, inspired by Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, expresses the reality of a changing, or turning, world in which there is a time and place for everything. Here are some of the lyrics to the song,

“To everything (turn, turn, turn)
There is a season (turn, turn, turn)
And a time for every purpose, under heaven

A time to be born, a time to die
A time to plant, a time to reap
A time to kill, a time to heal
A time to laugh, a time to weep.”

The song reminds us there is a time and place for everything under heaven, even a time for change.

We need to find space for our Sunday School students. With so many ministries unfolding in one building, finding some real estate to grow a program can be difficult. One space that could be reclaimed for usage is the Sunday School closet in the hospitality area of the gym. A team of people will need to help get through and clean out the closet.

It would be great to get a small team together to journey into the Sunday School storage closet and clean out the area for ministry. There is a lot of history in the Sunday School storage closet that can be passed on to somewhere else. The scope of this project is to take a couple of days to get the closet organized and cleaned out. I would develop a list of tasks before we start the transition.

The goal would be to have a location where the Sunday School could have a launching pad for the education hour. In my mind, the Sunday School closet could be like a beach shack where you can rent snorkels, canoes, flippers, etc... but instead, for Sunday School learning materials. The Sunday School shack would be where the spark of faith begins the day for Sunday School students. Would you be willing to help build a stronger foundation for Sunday School?

There has not been any information regarding the experiment of forming a Youth Praise Band. This was intentional due to holiday season schedules and the craziness that surrounds our lives during such high, holy seasonal times. Since it is past Easter, it is time to revisit the idea of Team Praise Band Youth. There will be an opportunity shortly to serve God through music. Getting a small youth group together to start a praise band would be awesome! Students can be 10 to 18 years of age, yet must be able to practice music and play in a group format. Hopefully, this ministry can help the youth feel more connected to God through preparation and performance. All youth are invited to join a musical journey grounded in praise to God. This opportunity will be an exciting and fun expression of praise through music.
