What's Up With Germany?

You may have noticed that I, recently have been focusing a lot on German history and language. I've been doing this in tandem with the congregational trip for this coming September. I've also been learning about Germany as a continuing education project because in the 16th century some important events happened in Germany that continue to shape us today.

Thirty years ago, I studied Lutheran history in seminary. I got a good glimpse of what had happened with Martin Luther and the impacts they had. Today, I'm working to understand these important events more deeply because the protestant reformation of the 16th century reshaped the worlds of culture, power, religion and politics. The movements that came out of Germany five hundred years ago continue to shape us to this day. Our church, country, and culture are rooted in ideas and movements that came before us. The past matters, in this moment.



Today, our society is asking questions about the relationships of church, politics, and power as we grapple with the real dangers of Christian nationalism, which seem to be on the rise in America. We are trying to figure out what religious centers hold us and compel us into meaningful ministry. In times of trouble and uncertainty we are asking, how to speak in ways that the gospel message of Jesus Christ will be heard. These contemporary questions were at the heart of the 16th century protestant reformation, a period of history that was about so much more than a monk nailing 95 theses on a church door in Wittenberg, Germany.

I admit it: I'm a curious nerd who is studying language, culture, and history to learn more about religious life in western civilization today. This matters because preachers are called to help their communities interpret God's action in the world, in the present. Understanding more deeply the movements that have shaped us to be who we are, I hope to strengthen my pastoral leadership as a Biblical scholar, student of the world, and curious fellow, so that I might be a better pastor in ministry. We stand in the Lutheran Tradition, a robust system of faith that equips us in powerful ways. As I learn German, read Martin Luther's works, and study the empires of the past, I am learning about us, who we are, how we came to be a Lutheran church in Waukesha, and more.

Germany Trip: Lederhosen Not Required

Twenty people will travel together in September to explore German history, culture and civic life. Sixteen of the twenty are St. Luke's members. Travel is an important sign of congregational health and vibrancy. A healthy congregation explores the world and learns together. During the trip to Germany, we'll explore the roots of Lutheranism. We'll visit many sites important to Lutheran history and learn together about Martin Luther's impact in the world. We'll also be exploring sites related to Lutheran Church Music: St. Thomas Church in Leipzig, and J. S. Bach House in Eisenach. We'll be touching on World War II history throughout the trip, especially when we visit Dachau Concentration Camp. We'll do so much more. Pray for this group as we travel September 9-20 and be ready to hear our stories when we return.

ELCA Youth Gathering

Time may be speeding up because the seasons seem to be moving quicker than ever. It is time to speak about summer! Summertime at St Luke's is a traditional time when our youth experience God through their love and service to their neighbor, which usually means it's time to travel.



This year, we have a memorable summer in store for our youth. Our youth will attend the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans, LA, July 16 to 20. This extraordinary event happens every three years, where thousands of high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. The youth will spend time in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service, and fellowship to help inspire them to grow in their faith, be challenged, and motivated to live their faith daily. While some experiences can be replicated at home, some are unique and special to the Gathering because of the ministry's size and scope.

Five core goals have been envisioned for the youth at the Gathering: to affirm and challenge them in their faith, help them experience new perspectives, help them ponder their vocation, help them bond with their congregational group, and help them learn more about the ELCA and our partnerships. The ELCA Youth Gathering will be a life-changing, life-giving opportunity for those who attend and connect.

Throughout the summer, many of us enjoy some time away to disconnect and to get some respite or vacation. It is very good for us all to get away and disconnect for a little while to receive self-care. However, after a long summer, with all the different opportunities we may have experienced, we may need a renewal of energy renewal.

Looking Forward to Fall and Welcome Day

Not to put summer on the back burner, but it is essential to start spreading the word about a significant "Welcome" event in September at St Luke's. This year, St. Luke's will revisit a rallying event that welcomes us back into our faith from the summer by celebration. On Sunday, September 8, at Bethesda Park after 10:30 a.m. worship, we will have a "Welcome Day" celebration. What used to be called Rally Day will now be called Welcome Day. Welcome Day is a celebratory day where the church calls or rallies us back from summer to our faith at the start of the school year in September. Welcome Day will be a fun way to return from summer with celebration and positive energy while we kick-start the next program year.

Welcome day is Sunday, September 8, at Bethesda Park from 12:00 to 2:00 p.m. We will have special "Welcome Day" activities for kids and adults starting at 12:00 p.m. For lunch, we will have pulled pork, shredded chicken, and roasted corn. All of St. Luke's will be invited to join in the fun and bring a dish to pass.

We look forward to "Welcoming" our faith into the new year this September.
