## Giving is Heart Work

From the heart comes all sorts of expressions: love, joy, and peace. Sometimes the opposite of these, too. In the heart, God is at work, always transforming us from the self-centered ways of sin to life-giving actions for the neighbor.

Because God is at work, the constant struggle present within us – between that which God desires and that which we desire – is nudged daily toward the direction of God's will. We mature into Christ, putting aside our ways and striving to bring about that which God wants.



Generosity is a key part of that movement. Where and how we use what God has given to us can make many differences in the world. Where we invest ourselves shapes who and how we become. We always have choices to make: between bettering our own lives, or in the name of Christ bettering the lives of our neighbors; of holding on to all God has given, instead of returning a portion to God as a sign of our love, devotion, and thankfulness.

Examining our hearts and asking where we invest our time, talents, and treasures reveals what sort of heart work is being done in and through us. If I choose to feather my own nest and not worry about the neighbor, I ignore the call of Jesus to love the neighbor as ourselves. If my heart moves me toward hatred and abuse of others, I reveal that the grace of God has not moved me toward God's intended ways of mercy, love, and acceptance.

This November, we will be challenging each other, in the annual stewardship campaign, to examine our hearts and to be moved by three impulses: love, service, and generosity in giving. These movements always draw us closer to God and the neighbor while turning us away from ourselves.

I invite you to engage in these themes as we focus on them each week. As we examine these themes, let the Holy Spirit shape the work of your heart so that you express more love, are moved to Christian service, and give generously for the sake of God's mission in the world.

## Congregational Gift Received

St. Luke's has received a generous gift from Al and Ella Mueller. The gift given through their children totals \$100,000 for two purposes. First, is to help us raise up a staff member who will work with members new and old, to become more engaged in the ministries we share. Second, the gift establishes a new organ repair fund to which they challenge others to give. In their giving, Al and Ella have continued to do among us what they have always done: they are moving us into the future by sharing of the bounty God has given. We are thankful for this gift and honor the memory of Al and Ella.

I also give thanks for a great staff who works well together. After serving many smaller congregations, it is nice to be part of a collaborative setting again! Thanks to all the staff who have patiently helped me “learn the system” of computers and phones, procedures, weekly rhythms and more.

Pastor Jordan and I work closely together to tend to ministry priorities and tasks. We both of course are involved in core ministries such as Worship and Pastoral Care. My duties may shift over time according to need, but to start out some areas of my focus/oversight will be Stewardship, Sunday School, and Search Bible Study. My call here is  $\frac{3}{4}$  time, most weeks I’ll be in the office Monday to Wednesday, work from home on Thursdays, and Friday is a day off.

The following year I enrolled at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. It was a good decision, not only academically/professionally... but it is also where I met my husband Brian! Brian is an ELCA pastor as well, serving at St. Stephen the Martyr in Greendale.

When not pastoring or parenting, I enjoy spending time outdoors, reading and writing, and spending time with family and friends.

It is a congregational process that is led by a team of people appointed by the Church Council. While we know that we will have an interim-type Associate Pastor, we don't know what our next permanent staffing will be. The council is now forming the MET team. Pray for them as they do this important work.

## ELCA World Hunger Celebrates 50th Anniversary

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) will celebrate World Food Day and the 50th anniversary of ELCA World Hunger during a special online event, Tuesday, October 15, at 7:00 p.m. The event will be hosted by the Rev. Amy Current, bishop of the Southeastern Iowa Synod, and Imran Siddiqui, ELCA vice president.

"ELCA World Hunger is a great example of how we are church together and church for the sake of the world," said ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton. "I have witnessed firsthand the impact of ELCA World Hunger on communities around the world. During a trip to the Yunnan province of China, I had the opportunity to visit with the Lisu people at a farm where they grew crops to help support their families with food and clothing. The partnership with ELCA World Hunger changed traditional farming methods to help lift people out of poverty."

"ELCA World Hunger is one of the best things we do as a church," Siddiqui said. "For 50 years, we have embodied 'God's work. Our hands.' by feeding those who are hungry around the world, and we have made a real difference. I look forward to 50 more years, and beyond that, of feeding the hungry and fighting poverty in our country and the world."

During the event, participants will hear stories from ELCA World Hunger partners — including Educación Popular en Salud (EPES), a community health organization in Chile founded over 40 years ago, and more recently established ministries including Tapestry Farms, a Midwestern urban farm system in the Quad Cities of Iowa and Illinois. These partners will talk about their work with ELCA World Hunger and the impact of their ministries on the communities they serve.

"We are grateful for the ministry of welcome and dignity Tapestry Farms provides the refugees who make the Quad Cities their home," Current said. "The partnership with World Hunger strengthens their capacity to invest in the lives of the refugees and their families as they seek to build meaningful lives in our community."

The world has experienced a decline in hunger since ELCA World Hunger was founded in 1974, but now, 50 years later, the number of people affected by hunger globally is increasing because of rising costs, global conflict, the effects of climate change and the lingering effects of COVID-19. "We are grateful for the generosity of ELCA members and others who have responded to God's promise of a just world where all are fed," Eaton said. "We look forward to the next 50 years of transformational work through ELCA World Hunger."
