God Does It All!

January brings a good reminder for us to remember what God has done for us in Holy Baptism. The first Sunday, following Epiphany is always "Baptism of our Lord" Sunday. On it, we hear the story of Christ's baptism from one of the gospels and use it as a way to consider God's work in the water.

Our Lutheran heritage stresses that we do nothing in baptism, but God does. We celebrate that in Holy Baptism our Gracious Heavenly Father sets us free from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of Jesus. God does the action. God sets us free, forgives us and gives us eternal life. All of this God does by connecting us to the death and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus.



We live our lives out trusting that God has done this completely for us and that God has done it correctly. trusting God, we no longer worry about whether we have done "the faith" well enough to merit salvation. We simply Trust that Christ's death gives us new life when God joins us to the saving work of Jesus on the Cross. Once baptized, we live lives of faith.

January is a great time of the year for this reminder. The calendar pages have been turned. A new year is upon us. The past is behind, the future is ahead. We live now. So it is with Christ. There is past, present, and future. What God has done for us in the past gives us faith in the present and helps us trust God's future for us.

The ancient call of faith repeated in our liturgy helps us remember this three fold focus of religious life: We call it the mystery of faith: "Christ has died." That's the past. "Christ is risen." That's the reality in which we live. "Christ will come again." That's an expression of our trust that we will be caught up in eternal life by Jesus who is yet to come.

It's January and I encourage you to think about the past, present and future as we head into the new year. You were joined to Christ's death... When were you baptized? You live now in the resurrection of Jesus Christ... How do you currently express your faith in Jesus? You will live again, When Christ comes in his glory. How do anticipate and celebrate what God will do for you?

Committing to Worship

We are encouraging each other all year long to commit/recommit to deeper engagement in worship. Perhaps you've drifted away from regular worship attendance. Come back and let God feed you in the Word and at the table of Holy Communion. Maybe while you're here, you might be called to participate more fully in the liturgies we speak and sing together. Commit yourself/yourselves to deeper engagement in worship. The more you engage God in worship, the deeper your relationship with him grows.

Rejoice!

⁴ Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. ⁵ Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶ Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” (Philippians 4: 4-7)

These are ancient words (written by the Apostle Paul), written to an ancient church (the first church established in what is now modern-day Greece). But these ancient words have grit and wisdom that I think our modern-day ears long to hear.



I don't know about you, but some days it feels downright HARD to rejoice. No months are immune from hardships. But sometimes I feel like January is particularly hard. Here in Wisconsin, it's cold and dark and spring seems far off. We may be exhausted after the holidays – a time of heightened yet unrealistic expectations of “the perfect Christmas.”

Maybe things didn't quite go as planned. Maybe you are missing somebody. Maybe there were family tensions. Maybe you're struggling to accept the things you cannot change. I have no doubt that you could probably add to this list of “reasons it can be HARD to rejoice.”

“Rejoice in the Lord always” might sound like “just put on a happy face,” ... but it is NOT that. Joy cannot be forced or artificially manufactured. Perhaps no one knew this better than Paul... who was writing these words while in prison. So just what could make Paul write these words?! Sitting in a jail cell seems like one on the least conducive environments for rejoicing!

There's a small sentence that Paul slips into this letter... “The Lord is near.” (vs. 5) Just four words, but it's a powerful statement of belief and trust. Even in the midst of trying and incomprehensible circumstances, Paul clung to the promise that God is right there in the midst of all of it.

The source of Paul's rejoicing was NOT because he was guaranteed that everything was going to be “just fine.” Much like us when we find ourselves in a difficult time, Paul had to sit with the unknowns. Even with all the uncertainty, Paul could talk about rejoicing because he trusted that “The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” (Phil. 4:7)

In this New Year, it's my prayer that you can envision your hearts and minds being guarded by Jesus, the lover of our souls. Amidst all the unknowns, amidst all the disappointments and sadness of this world - may we rejoice that we still have Emmanuel, the God who promises to be forever with us and forever for us.

January 27: Registration for St. Luke's church members, families with children currently enrolled in the Child Care program at St. Luke's and families who have had children in our Preschool Program in past years
