## A Time to Love

February, because of Valentine's Day, is sometimes referred to as the "month of love." Kind of arbitrary, yes?! And while Hallmark and Brach's might capitalize on the sentimentality of the day, as Christians we know that **every** day is a good day to express love!

God calls us to love - and not just those we "are in love with." (Think life partners, family, good friends). God's love goes beyond sentimentality or "easy," stretching us out of our comfort zones to love the stranger; the outsider; all those who might speak, look or act differently than we do.



God calls us to love **all**. And wouldn't you know, that includes the person who pushes all your buttons; the person with whom you don't see eye to eye; the person you'd rather avoid altogether. God doesn't say we have to be chummy friends with everyone; but we are expected to love.

Love, as it turns out, is not always as easy as a Hallmark movie! Sometimes love comes easy. But more often than not, love calls for a little something extra: God's help. Left to our own human inclinations, it's impossible to love when we'd rather not; or when it's hard or inconvenient or complicated. But we who have the Spirit of love graciously gifted to us, we can call upon this very Spirit to strengthen us with the power to love.

In 1957, in one of his most famous sermons, *Loving Your Enemies*, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. preached: "Returning hate for hate multiplies hate, adding deeper darkness to a night already devoid of stars. Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

It's a message that still rings true today. In a world of deep divisions, animosities and strife, the call to love is needed perhaps now more than ever.

Shortly before his betrayal, Jesus told his disciples, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. **By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.**" (John 13:34-35)

In his role of Vice President of the Tanzania Partnership Committee of the Greater Milwaukee Synod, PJ has returned to Tanzania to visit partners of the synod and the five partner congregations of St. Luke's. He will be one of 18 participating in the synod's Bishop's Delegation to the Meru Diocese, January 21 through February 6, 2025. The delegation will tour Mount Meru Coffee Project, visit partnership parishes on two weekends, visit the seminary in Ailanga, Learn about the "Telescopes for Tanzania" project, visit the pharmacy at Ngarenuiki, spend time at the Leguruki Health Center, learn more about plans for the Makimura Farm development, explore the synod's university, meet children at the Nkoranga Orphanage and the Ngaza Primary School, and spend time exploring Tanzanian culture, nature, and more.
