The campaign received pledges of about \$880,000 from the congregation. We are blessed with such generosity and close to our target, but we currently stand with about \$100,000 of pledges outstanding. As we work to remove our debt, there is New Life Rising at St. Luke's with a vision to widen our community connections and our welcome to all who come.
