"Two Are Better Than One" – Calling a New Partner in Ministry

As we go deeper into the process of calling an Associate Pastor to join our ministry team, I'd like to take a moment to reflect with you on how we practice partnership of ministry when there are two pastors. Many of you have asked: What does the associate pastor do? And just as importantly, how does a second pastor's role complement Pastor Jordan's? Let me share a glimpse of the design we're shaping—one rooted in collaboration, mutual trust, and shared commitment to the Gospel.



One Office, Two Shepherds: At St. Luke's, we believe that the pastoral office is not a solo act. It's a shared calling. While I will continue to serve as Senior Pastor, I'll be joined by a new Associate Pastor who will bring fresh energy, creativity, and focus to particular areas of our shared life together. This is about deepening our reach, strengthening our care, and widening the embrace of Christ's love.

Worship: Shared Leadership, Fresh Perspectives: I will continue to lead our Worship Life Ministries, overseeing the rhythm and direction of our worship. Yet worship at St. Luke's has never been static—and our new Associate Pastor will bring vibrant contributions to our planning and presence. Preaching and presiding will be shared regularly. Think of it as a dynamic duet: two voices, one message of hope.

A Heart for Care: Our Associate Pastor will continue to lead the Pastoral Care ministries of the church. This means encouraging and equipping our Care and Prayer Ministries leaders, building relationships with our homebound members, and keeping close watch over those who need comfort and prayer. Together, we'll make hospital visits and respond to life's unexpected turns. But it will be the Associate who tends the daily soil of this vital ministry.

Growing Faith at Every Age: The Associate Pastor will be the lead gardener in our growing ministries of Christian education and youth formation—from Sunday School and Confirmation to summer trips and family events. This pastor will work closely with volunteers, staff, and parents to create a vibrant ecosystem of learning, worship, and fellowship for the next generation.

Outreach and Community Engagement: Where I'll continue representing St. Luke's in city-wide partnerships and ecumenical outreach, our Associate Pastor will dig deep into local mission work—strengthening ties with schools, shelters, and service organizations. The Associate will also lead our hospitality ministry, helping visitors become friends and friends become family.

Support and Supervision: Behind the scenes, I'll continue to carry the responsibility for overall staff supervision, vision-setting, and strategic direction—working closely with Council, committees, and our leadership teams. The Associate Pastor will be a supportive partner in these efforts, contributing voice and wisdom while focusing their leadership on the ministries of care, formation, and connection.

Why This Matters: This is not just a list of duties. It's a vision of ministry shared and multiplied. With two pastors, we can do more than simply "cover more ground." We can be more present, more responsive, and more creative in the ways we serve Christ and this community.

So, as we enter this season of discernment, I invite you to pray for the one God is already preparing to serve among us... and for our congregation as we prepare to welcome a new voice, a new heart, a new partner in the holy work we share.

Hold On Tight!

“Hold fast to the Lord your God, as you have done to this day.” (Joshua 23:8)

“Hold on tight!” Parents or grandparents may say this to a child first learning how to swing on a swing. “Grab on to my shirt and don’t let go!” we may say to a companion while trying to make our way through a crowd (such as at the State Fair!)



Holding on and letting go... these are things we do not just as children, but over and over again throughout our lives. And sometimes it can be hard to know when to hold on, and when it’s time to let go.

Sometimes holding on can be a wise choice, as the Wilson Phillips’ 90s song asks, “Can you hold on, for one more day? And things will go your way.” Holding on can mean not giving up quite yet, giving things a little more time, waiting in hope to see what might be around the corner.

And yet we know that things *don’t* always go our way! Despite working at things, giving our all, sometimes things will not turn out as we’d like. And then it can be time to let go. As the Serenity Prayer says, “God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; courage to change the things I can; and the wisdom to know the difference.”

The “wisdom to know the difference” is the key to this prayer. And the wisdom to hold on or to let go needs to come from God. How often have you been stumped over a situation or a decision you’ve needed to make? And how well or not well does it work for you to try to power through and come up with the answer on your own?

It’s August – a time when the seasons are getting ready to transition, kids are getting ready to transition back to the classroom, and *all* of us most likely have *some* kind of transition going on in our lives!

And so I ask: What might you do to navigate the seasons/transition(s) in your own life? What spiritual practices (like prayer, journaling, holy conversation with a friend) might you find helpful? I encourage you to carve out some time this month for quietness and reflection.

And whether the answers we get to our prayers are either “Hold on” or “Let go,”... let us always remember to “Hold fast to the Lord our God,” who guides us through it all.

Discipleship Training Gearing Up for the Fall

Ministry is soon kicking off for the 2025-2026 program year. Rally Sunday is September 7. As expected, we are continuing our highly successful Discipleship Training program. All youth, grades 6th-8th, are invited to be involved.

Discipleship Training is the name of our Middle School confirmation ministry. It is a weekly time to get together and share a meal, participate in games, and grow in faith. Discipleship Training is also our middle school youth group. We will meet as we did last year, **Wednesday nights, 6:00 to 8:00 p.m.**

DT is specifically designed for youth to deepen their faith in a social setting. Each week, there'll be food, fun, a bit of silliness, and a spiritual focus designed to help youth engage in questions about their faith. PJ will continue to work with Discipleship Training. He loves the energy of Middle School Youth and looks forward to helping them grow in faith. There will be great conversations, engaging activities, and meaningful interactions – perhaps with some silly string added in.

The first gathering of Discipleship Training will be Wednesday, September 10, at 6:00 p.m. We will walk through particulars of the ministry, train youth to serve as acolytes, and have fun together. DT Gatherings will happen (mostly) weekly throughout the school year.

Sunday, September 14, we'll pray over each DT participant at the 10:30 a.m. service, asking God to guide them in their faith journey through the year. We will also give each new DT students a "Lutheran Study Bible" as a gift to help them grow in faith. We will use this Bible weekly in our gatherings. Youth should bring their Bibles with them each week, along with the Small Catechism they will receive as the program begins.

Encourage youth to participate in the program. Each week, **host parents** do two things at DT: 1) provide food for the group, and 2) participate in the evening's activities as a guide and participant. Each family rotates in this opportunity.
