Listening for God's Call

In the Lutheran tradition, we speak often about "call." Every baptized Christian is called by God—to follow Jesus, to live faithfully in daily life, to serve neighbors near and far. Martin Luther reminded us that God's call is not only about extraordinary things but about the ordinary, daily vocations of life: parent, child, friend, worker, student, neighbor. Wherever we live, work, and serve, God's Spirit is calling us to bear Christ's love in word and action.

At the same time, we also recognize a particular kind of call within the church. Some Christians are called by God—and affirmed by the church—to serve as pastors. A pastor's call is not a job one simply applies for and receives like any other profession. Instead, it is a call that arises from God's Spirit, discerned in community, prayed over by a congregation, and confirmed by the whole church. When a congregation extends a pastoral call, it is both a sacred responsibility and a joyful proclamation: "We believe God is at work in you and among us."



On Sunday, November 2, our congregation will gather to vote on extending such a call to Pastor Maren Hooper, inviting her to serve as our full-time Associate Pastor. This is a significant moment in the life of St. Luke's. It is an expression of trust that God is leading us, and that Pastor Maren's gifts for preaching, teaching, and pastoral care will help shape our shared ministry in the years to come.

As we prepare for this day, I encourage you to hold two things in your heart. First, pray for our congregation and for Pastor Maren, that together we may discern God's will with clarity and joy. Second, reflect on your own sense of call. Where is God stirring you? How might you follow Christ more deeply in your daily life? Whether you serve in the home, the workplace, the community, or the church, you are already called by God.

God's call is always both personal and communal. God calls us individually to follow Jesus, and God calls us together as a congregation to be Christ's body in the world. On November 2, as we vote to extend a call to Pastor Maren, we remember that each of us also carries a call—to live faithfully, to serve generously, and to trust that God's Spirit is always leading us into new life.

Celebrating All Saints in Two Ways

All Saints Day is Saturday, November 1. We'll be observing this important date in two ways. First, Saturday, November 1, we'll hold a memorial service at 3:00 p.m. in the chapel for families of the congregation who have lost loved ones this year. Then, on Saturday and Sunday, November 1 and 2, we'll remember the saints in our weekend worship services. At those services, we'll celebrate those who have entered new life through Holy Baptism and death. We will read the names of the newly baptized and those who have passed. There will be opportunities for people to remember loved ones who have died and to light candles in their memory.

Thankfulness as a Spiritual Discipline

As we turn our calendars to November, our minds naturally drift toward the holidays. Retailers know that Christmas is the big Money Maker, so it's no surprise that they start stocking the shelves with all the goods earlier and earlier each year. While Christmas can be a blessed time, it also makes me sad when it tends to overshadow what comes first – Thanksgiving and Advent!

Don't worry, I'm not going to go all Grinch here and tell you not to prepare for Christmas. Rather, I urge us all to try (as best we can!) to stay in the season we're in. Because it's a **spiritual discipline** to "be where your feet are."



I love Thanksgiving and Advent for many reasons, but mostly because they ground us in the **spiritual disciplines of Giving Thanks and Waiting**. I'll save the Advent/Waiting column for another time, but for now let's dwell in Giving Thanks.

Of course, anytime is a good time to **Give Thanks**. But the truth is, sometimes we "let it slide," or the cares and concerns of the world make it easier to lament than to give thanks. It can take WORK some days to find something praiseworthy! Yet I believe that it's always possible. And I believe it's a worthwhile spiritual discipline to scan the horizons of our daily lives and find reasons to give thanks to God.

There are many ways to give thanks – out loud, in a journal, in a thank you note, in your prayers, and more. One idea I gleaned from a podcast, they called it "**doing your O.G.T.S.**" (**One Good Thing**) I like this idea because it's doable for everyone – it doesn't require much time but simply asks you to find One Good Thing in your day and give thanks for it.

Of course, you can do more - but even on the days you are stressed or overwhelmed or frazzled or going through a trying time, you most likely can find at least one thing to be thankful for.

And maybe, just maybe... in "doing our OGTS", we might find that our perspective shifts. Because the spiritual discipline of giving thanks trains us to see the good; to trust that God is still active in the world – bringing healing, hope, and love.

St. Luke's, I am thankful for each and every one of you, and the care and Good News we spread together in word and in deed!
