## Advent 2025 at St. Luke's – The Power of Yes

Every Advent, we step into a holy season of waiting—*watching* for God's coming, *preparing* our hearts, and *listening* closely for God's voice. This year, our Advent journey invites us into a simple but courageous theme: **The Power of Yes**.

In volatile, uncertain times, even the small yeses of daily life can feel weighty. Where do we place our trust? How do we use our time, our energy, our resources, our courage? When so much around us feels fragile, the act of saying “yes” to God's call may feel riskier than ever.

And yet, our Scriptures remind us that we come from a long line of people whose “yes” shaped the world.

This Advent we will trace the unfolding story of God's coming—not only through the familiar names of Mary and Joseph, but through the quiet, brave figures who's yes made room for Christ's birth. Each week we will explore one of these yeses:

**Advent 1 — Elizabeth & Zechariah Said Yes;**

**Advent 2 — John the Baptist Said Yes;**


**Advent 3 — Mary Said Yes; Advent 4 — Joseph Said Yes**

Moving into the Christmas season, we continue:

**Christmas Eve — The Shepherds Said Yes;**

**Christmas 1 — Joseph's Double Yes;**

**Christmas 2 — God Says Yes**



We are living in what feels like a liminal time. A time of upheaval, anxiety, and shifting ground. And yet—this is not the first time God's people have lived through such seasons. Advent reminds us that God's story *always* unfolds through ordinary people whose faithfulness creates space for the extraordinary.

Every yes in Scripture is offered in the shadow of empire, in the uncertainty of fragile lives, and in the vulnerability of real human fear. And yet, God works through these yeses to shape a new future.

Your Yes Matters, so we invite you into deeper participation—not just in worship, but in reflection:

1.) Where is God inviting you to say yes?	3.) What yes might bring healing, courage, or joy?
2.) What yes feels difficult for you right now?	4.) What yes might lead you closer to Christ?

Through worship, prayer, and song, we will listen for God together. We will wonder. We will wait. We will say yes—each in our own way—trusting that God is already working through these yeses to open a path toward hope.

I pray that this Advent becomes not just a countdown to Christmas, but a spacious season—a time to breathe, to reflect, to choose courage, and to trust the One who comes to meet us in every fragile yes. May this be a season where we, too, discover **The Power of Yes**.

## A “Reintroduction” of Sorts From Your New Associate Pastor

I am very happy to have accepted the call to Associate Pastor that you all extended to me on November 2! I feel so blessed to have this sacred role of pastor, and I look forward to exploring all God has in store for us together.

A big part of the “pastor-and-people” partnership is relationship building. I look forward to getting to know you all better, and hear how God has been active in your lives.

While I have been here for a while now, I realize I’m also kind of a “newbie!” A member suggested that I take some space in this column to do a “bio” of sorts, and I thought that was an excellent idea. Hopefully it’ll give you a little more background into my formation as a person and as a pastor. I’ll do it in two installments, consider this “Part I – Birth through College” :



I grew up the only child of Dave and Pam Loken, in Maple Grove, MN. My extended family mostly lives either in the Twin Cities or southern MN. The Hooper side of the family mostly lives in the Chicago suburbs, with a few in the Houston, TX area.

I am a “born and bred” Lutheran, my family of origin is very strong in their faith - for example my grandma taught many years of Sunday School and Search Bible Studies, and she was the first woman in her congregation to serve as a Council President. (I still have some of her materials which are filled with copious notes in her lovely handwriting!)

I was fortunate to have great experiences as a youth in my home congregation. I went on youth trips like canoeing in the BWCA, participated in youth group, and was positively influenced by excellent pastors and youth directors. Throughout high school I also had a cross country and track coach and friends who were also very open about discussing matters of faith.

Towards the end of high school, one of my pastors told me he saw gifts in me to be a pastor, and took me to a Seminary Visit Day. It was a nice experience, but at that point I was not super convinced that it was a good fit for my mostly-introverted self! I have always enjoyed writing, so I went off to college with plans to become a journalist.

I loved my four years at Luther College. It was there that my worldview really expanded, as I got to know people from many different backgrounds, experiences and countries. Being a college of the ELCA there were religion requirements - but as I got through the basics, I found myself wanting to take more. Meanwhile the English major was not really geared toward journalism and I was dreading taking Shakespeare with a tough professor I had already encountered! So lo and behold, I found myself switching my major to Religion.

Come Junior year, I still didn’t really have a clue what I was going to do with a religion major. Then I spent a month in Guatemala, and things began to shift. Immersed in a country with a tumultuous and sometimes violent history, our class explored matters of faith and justice. I witnessed the resiliency of people who had been through so much, and yet their faith in God was so deep. I saw Scripture through new sets of eyes, and heard with clarity the Gospel witness of God’s care and concern for the oppressed and marginalized.

I came back from that trip - still not sure that I was going to enroll in seminary – but confident that whatever I did with this religion major, I wanted to serve God and neighbor and give witness to a God who loves and cares for all – especially for the oft-overlooked and marginalized ones.

## ELCA Church Council Adopts Child Protection Social Message

The Church Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) met electronically on November 12. The council, which serves as the ELCA's board of directors, took action on a variety of matters intended to advance this church's mission and ministry.

In his report, Presiding Bishop Curry told the council of his decision to announce an in-person return to work for two days per week for all churchwide organization staff who live within 50 miles of the Lutheran Center in Chicago. Curry said his decision for the return to the workplace — expected to begin February 1, 2026 — was made in consultation with the churchwide organization administrative team and other churchwide organization leaders.

### In key action, the council:

- Adopted “Child Protection” as an official social message of the ELCA. See <https://www.elca.org/faith/faith-and-society/current-social-writing-projects/child-protection>
- Authorized reconsideration of identified sections in the social message “Homelessness: A Renewal of Commitment” (1990).
- Directed the Theological Discernment unit in the Office of the Presiding Bishop to begin development of study resources related to social teaching on white supremacy.
- Revised the spending authorization for fiscal year 2026 from \$61,500,000 to \$63,150,000.
- Approved recommendations for the churchwide organization, synods and congregations to support educational debt relief for rostered ministers, particularly rostered ministers who are women and/or members of historically under-represented groups. This action is in response to the final report of the Educational Debt Task Force, which was appointed by the Church Council in 2022.
- Authorized the Executive Committee to assess and respond to a request from the Endowment Fund of the ELCA (the ELCA Foundation).
- Approved revisions of “Manual of Policies and Procedures for Management of the Rosters of the ELCA” related to amendments to the ELCA constitutions approved by the 2025 Churchwide Assembly.
- Elected the Rev. Ralph Dunkin, Wheeling, W.V., to the Church Council for a six-year term ending August 2031. He fills a vacancy left by the Rev. Daniel Collins, who has resigned.
- Approved amendments to ELCA churchwide organization personnel policies.
- Appointed and elected members to fill vacancies on the following: Audit Committee; Committee of Hearing Officers; Committee on Appeals; board of directors for Trinity Lutheran Seminary at Capital University; board of trustees for United Lutheran Seminary; council liaison to the Corporate Social Responsibility review team.
- Approved amendments to continuing resolutions in “Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the ELCA” related to governance of the new Association of Synod Vice Presidents.
- Approved amendments to the restated bylaws of the board of pensions of the ELCA.
- Approved new health plan benefit options and proposed amendments to the ELCA Medical and Dental Benefits Plan, effective Jan. 1, 2026.
- Received reports and updates from the church officers and council committees.

The ELCA is one of the largest Christian denominations in the United States, with 2.7 million members in more than 8,400 worshiping communities across the 50 states and in the Caribbean region. Known as the church of “God’s work. Our hands.”, the ELCA emphasizes the saving grace of God through faith in Jesus Christ, unity among Christians and service in the world. The ELCA’s roots are in the writings of the German church Reformer, Martin Luther.
