Before the Year Names You

January arrives without much ceremony. It comes not with hymns or fireworks, but with budgets, calendars, and unanswered emails. We open new planners and old worries. We make quiet promises to ourselves and carry old disappointments into yet another year. This is the season that tells us to begin again, to do better, to plan more carefully, to measure our lives against fresh expectations.

And yet before the year gets the chance to define you, the church pauses to remind you who you already are.



Early in January, the church celebrates the Baptism of Our Lord. We remember the moment when Jesus steps into the Jordan, when the waters close around him, and the voice of God speaks from heaven, calling him beloved before he has preached a sermon, healed a wound, or carried a cross. Jesus is named before he is tested. He is claimed before he is proven. The heart of our faith is revealed in that moment, because the same promise spoken over Christ is spoken over us.

Baptism is the church's way of telling the truth about you before the world tries to tell its own story. It is God's declaration that you belong, not because you succeeded last year and not because you have resolved to do better this year, but simply because God is faithful. Baptism is not a symbol of our commitment to God. It is a proclamation of God's commitment to us. It is not God keeping track of your growth. It is God holding on to you when you grow tired.

We are often tempted at the beginning of the year to measure ourselves by productivity or progress. We wonder what we achieved, what we failed to do, what we ought to do differently this time around. But faith begins somewhere else. It begins with the simple truth that before you make a plan, God has already made a promise. Before you list a goal, God has already given you grace. Before you question your worth, God has already spoken your name.

The water of baptism does not evaporate when life becomes complicated. The promise does not shrink when faith feels small. God does not step away when we struggle or wander or doubt. What God has claimed, God does not abandon. What God has named, God does not forget. You are not released from belonging when life becomes difficult or when belief feels fragile.

The world will do its best this year to tell you who you are. Some days it will praise you. Other days it will ignore you. Sometimes it will value you for what you produce. Sometimes it will make you feel as though you are only as good as your last success or failure. It will invite you to believe that you are defined by what you earn, what you manage, or what you cannot quite fix.

Baptism tells a different story.

A “Reintroduction of Sorts” - Part II!

If you missed my “Part I Bio” make sure to go back to the December Epistle and read that! The “cliffhanger” was that I came back from an impactful study abroad trip my junior year of college, thinking about enrolling in seminary but still not sure. Given that I’m now a pastor, suffice it to say that I *did* follow those nudges to enroll in seminary!

I knew I needed a little break from the books though and wanted some hands-on life experience before starting my studies at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC). So, in the Fall of 2001, I traded the college dorms for a different sort of communal living. I spent a year in El Paso, Texas with three other housemates while we all participated in Border Servant Corps (kind of like AmeriCorps, but faith-based).



My volunteer placement was at *Iglesia Luterana Cristo Rey*, an ELCA congregation comprised mostly of Mexican immigrants. My role with the church was to coordinate Border Immersion Experiences, where we’d host week-long learning excursions with all sorts of groups – church groups, college kids over Spring Break and more. But before I could be a coordinator, I had my own Border Immersion experience of sorts: hearing the stories and migration journeys of members, and learning from the larger community – everything from legal advocates, shelters, pro-bono doctors and dentists serving in Juarez, and more.

I learned how to drive a 12-passenger van and how to navigate border crossings (as we’d also travel to Juarez to meet with partners.), which got especially long and tricky that year after 9/11. That didn’t stop us though!

I had the good fortune to spend the year leading groups through the same eye-opening and heart-expanding experiences I had come to know. It was a year I’ll always treasure – being an “outsider,” yet entrusted with guiding and sharing stories that help us all come to a larger awareness of the presence of God in all people and cultures.

In the Fall of 2002, I packed up the bags again and began seminary in Chicago. I loved taking classes in the Windy City, on the south side within a mile’s walk of Lake Michigan. I lived with three other seminarians in campus-owned brownstones, as we all learned more about the Bible, church history, worship and preaching, pastoral care and more.

Then I met this guy Brian Hooper in one of my classes. We began running together, and not too long after that started dating. By the end of that first year, we were talking marriage, but there was just one little hiccup – he was a graduating senior and would soon be assigned to his first call! We’d figure it out, somehow: he got a call-in small town Le Sueur, Minnesota, (about ½ hour south of the Twin Cities), I finished up my second year at LSTC, got married that summer and moved. I was able to finish seminary by commuting up to Luther in St. Paul and taking online classes.

The next few years were a bit of a blur as I did an internship in Mankato, finished courses, graduated, and our first child Norah was born in February 2007. In September 2007 Brian accepted a new call in New Berlin, and we moved to Wisconsin. Brian now serves at St. Stephen the Martyr ELCA in Greendale, where he has served the last 11 years.

I spent a few years doing pulpit supply and other church work and was ordained at Mount Carmel Lutheran in Milwaukee in 2010. Our son Ben was also born in 2010 – so more busy years!

In the years between now and then, interim ministry has found me serving churches of various sizes including in West Allis, Pewaukee, Hartland, Wauwatosa, Muskego and West Milwaukee.

Interim ministry was good... but let’s just say I am THRILLED to now be settling into one place here at St. Lukes! I am grateful for your warm welcome and support of my ministry among you all; and I’m excited to see how God will lead us all and guide our service in the coming years!

It says that you are already held. It says that you are known more fully than you could ever manage to be on your own. It says that the love of God is not transactional and does not adjust to your performance. You do not start each year trying to earn your place with God. You begin each year standing firmly inside a grace that was given long before you were aware you needed it.

So perhaps January does not need to be the season when you reinvent yourself. Perhaps it is simply the season when you remember whose you are. The year ahead will hold ordinary days and unexpected turning points. It will offer moments that will fill your heart and others that will test it. There will be days when gratitude comes easily and days when showing up will feel like a holy act all by itself. Whatever this year brings, you will not walk into it unmarked or unnoticed.

You go into it baptized, and that is not a small thing.

Angel Tree Program – A Big THANK YOU!

On December 15, the Angel Tree Team, with the help of several Amigos, delivered 40 cartons of gifts to both Hadfield Elementary and other Waukesha families who were supported through our 2025 Angel Tree project. The principal and staff at Hadfield, as well as other key administrative personnel at our other recipient location, were overwhelmed with the colorfully wrapped, abundant gifts.

To recap the congregation's efforts for this, it took only 12 days for all 158 gift wishes to be claimed from the Angel Tree. More than 225 gifts, not just 158, were actually returned, including over \$2,500 in gift cards. 12 wonderful volunteers wrapped each and every gift.

We applied for one Thrivent grant for the Hadfield families and another grant for the other Waukesha families we served. Both grants were received and used for supplies, wrapping, and other necessities.

Additionally, our Good Samaritan Fund provided each of the 23 families with a food gift card.

Your generosity abounded in so many ways. Thank you is not a sufficient expression for this experience. We are truly blessed to have love for so many people we do not know.

4 Years Old (by 9/1/25): Classes meet 2 or 3 mornings a week-9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
