Following Jesus in Real Time

As we've watched recent events unfold in Minneapolis, I've been paying close attention to how churches have responded. Some gathered for prayer. Some showed up with food and water. Some opened their doors. Some spoke out. Some stayed quiet. Watching all of that has made me think—again—about what we do, and what we should do, as followers of Christ when the world feels heavy and raw.

Because when something happens “out there,” it doesn't stay out there for long. It finds its way into our homes, onto our phones, into our conversations, and into our prayers. Sooner or later, we have to ask the honest question: *What does following Jesus look like right now?*

For many of us, that question makes us uneasy. We've been taught—sometimes directly, sometimes by habit—that faith should be personal and politics avoided. And it's true: the church is not a political party, and Jesus never handed out a platform or endorsed candidates. But Jesus also never stayed on the sidelines of human life. He paid attention to who was hurting, who was excluded, who had power, and who didn't. He spoke about daily bread, fairness, mercy, and dignity. He healed bodies and restored people to community—in public.

At its heart, *politics* is about people—how we live together and who is protected when things go wrong. In that sense, following Jesus will always touch the shared life we hold in common. Not in partisan ways, but in deeply human ones. The way of Christ is concerned with real lives, real suffering, and real hope.

Our Lutheran faith helps us hold this honestly. We know the world is broken—not just by individual choices, but by systems and habits that can harm. At the same time, we trust that God is at work in the world as it is, not just as we wish it to be. God works through ordinary people, imperfect institutions, and small acts of faithfulness.

That means we don't have to have everything figured out before we act. Faithful Christians will not always agree on what justice looks like in practice, and that's okay. What matters is how we engage one another—with humility, care, and love of neighbor. We ask hard questions. We listen. We keep paying attention to those who are most vulnerable or easily ignored.

When early Christians said, “Jesus is Lord,” they were making a claim about loyalty. No nation, leader, or ideology could claim their ultimate trust. That confession still matters. It frees us from fear and sends us back into the world—not as saviors or spectators, but as people shaped by grace.

So we keep watching the world with open eyes and tender hearts. We keep asking what love requires of us—here and now. We trust that God is not distant from the pain or division we see, and that our small acts of faithfulness matter. As people shaped by grace, we step forward neither in fear nor in certainty, but in hope—seeking the well-being of our neighbors and the healing of the world God so dearly loves.



“Go Get Your Feet Upon A Rock”

“I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry.²He drew me up from the desolate pit, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure.³He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Many will see and fear, and put their trust in the Lord.⁴Happy are those who make the Lord their trust, who do not turn to the proud, to those who go astray after false gods.” (Psalm 40:1-4)



This text is part of a devotion I read one mid-January morning, as chaos and violence descended upon my beloved home state of Minnesota. Granted, Minnesota is not the only place suffering: so many places in our world, so many people facing discrimination and hate and a denial of their basic humanity.

In the face of such destabilizing forces, it seemed incongruous to read words like “I waited patiently for the Lord.” How can we be patient when we want peace and justice and we want it NOW?!

But I kept reading: “He inclined to me and heard my cry; he drew me up from the desolate pit... and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure.”

That day, I happened to be at a mini-retreat near Lake Michigan. Walking around the grounds of Siena Center in Racine, the words of my morning devotion came back to mind, and I knew I had to get down by the water.

Down by the lake, I set my feet upon a solid rock and stayed there for a good half hour. (It was a blessedly mild January day!) I just sat there and let the sound of the waves coming in to shore wash over my troubled spirit. When I got up and continued on my walk, the circumstances remained much the same, but I felt perhaps a bit more grounded.

Grounded: I think it’s a good word to return to, especially when life is uncertain or scary or destabilizing. When times are hard, we might want to jump first to what we can do to “fix it.” And indeed our faith calls us all to do what we can to aid in the healing of the world.

But if we are destabilized, troubled in spirit, filled with fear – we might not be in the best headspace to serve. So what must we do first?

Get grounded; in Scripture, in nature, in community. Get grounded in whatever it is that reminds you best that God is still with us. Trusting that God still hears our cries. That God is still the solid rock we can cling to when everything around us is shaking.

Only when we are in a stable place can we move on to the next things; discerning what we are called to do next; discerning what God has gifted each of us with to use for the healing of our little corners of the world.

And when you feel weary or disheartened, remember a few things:

1. We’re the body of Christ, serving together. You don’t have to do ALL the things. Discern how God is calling YOU to respond and serve and focus on that. Trust that God is also calling others to other tasks.
2. It is God’s Spirit who equips us all. We serve not by our own will but by the power that God supplies. Trust that God will give you what you need. And that includes periods of rest too.

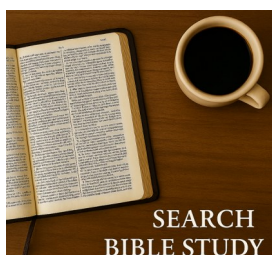

From February 9–24, I’ll (PJ) be in Erfurt, Germany for continuing education, and I wanted to share a bit about this time and why it matters for our life together.

Part of this trip will focus on language development. Learning and practicing German is a way of slowing down, listening more carefully, and remembering what it means to be a learner. Those habits—patience, curiosity, and attentiveness—are essential in ministry and in our shared life of faith.

I’ll also be spending time at the Augustinian Cloister in Erfurt, where Martin Luther studied and became a monk. My days there will center on studying, praying, worshiping, and learning, grounded in a rhythm that invites reflection and renewal.

There will be space as well for historical exploration, walking in places shaped by centuries of Christian faith and reform. History reminds us that the church has always lived through change, and that renewal often comes through learning and re-centering on God’s grace. I’m grateful to serve a congregation that values continuing education and renewal. I ask for your prayers during this time, trusting that God will use it to deepen my faith and strengthen our life together when I return.
